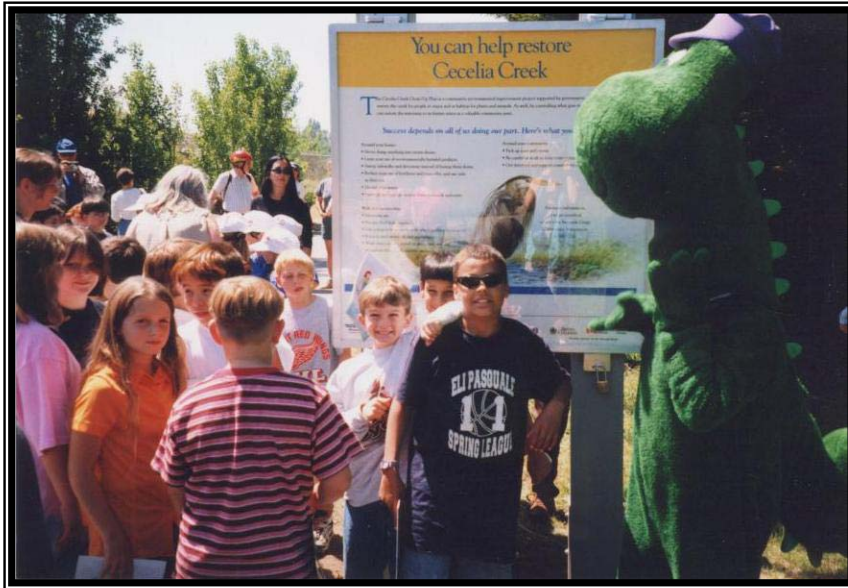

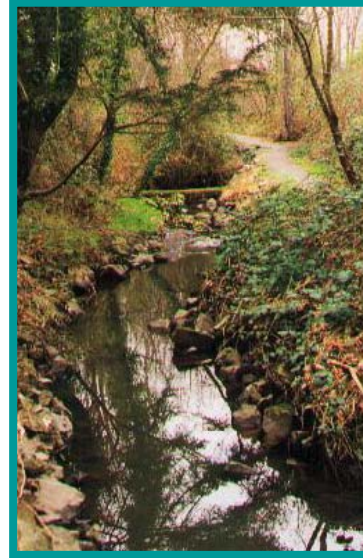


CECELIA CREEK

- Covers 23% of the City of Victoria
- Drainage basin fully developed
- Natural drainage system piped to facilitate stormwater drainage
- Seabed and shoreline contaminated from a former coal gasification plant and other historical industries.

I will sweep my sidewalks, driveways and patios instead of using a hose.

☐ Fertilising.

Help my family with composting to make my own safe fertilizer for lawns, gardens and plants.




☐ Pets.


I will pick up my pet's waste and keep my pet on a leash near waterways.

☐ Cars and Roads

I will encourage my family to wash cars at a commercial carwash, or over gravel or grassy areas.
When washing the car I will use biodegradable and phosphate free soap.

☐ I will walk and bike more to help my family reduce the use of the car.

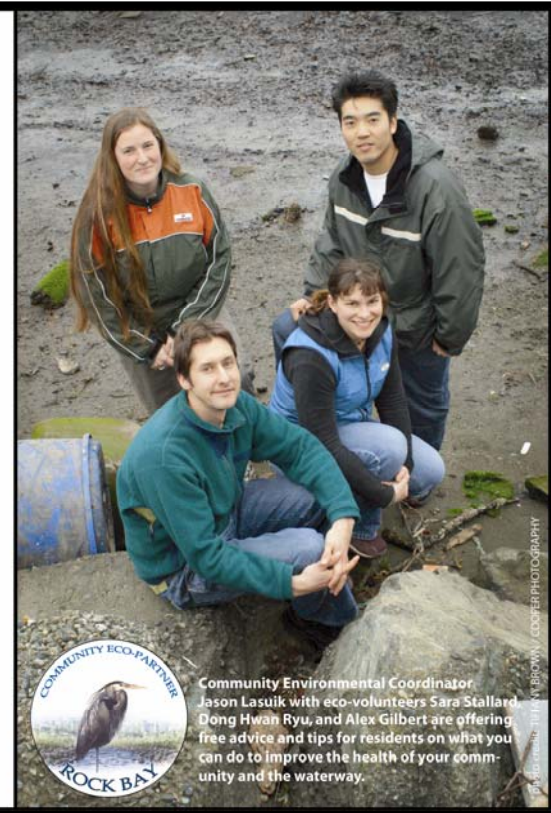
